Land resources - general land use; agricultural land use, Geographical conditions and distribution of major

crops (Wheat, Rice, Tea, Coffee, Cotton, Jute, Sugarcane and Rubber), agricultural development and

problems.

Water resources - availability and utilization-irrigation, domestic, industrial and other uses; scarcity of

water and conservation methods -rain water harvesting and watershed management.

Mineral and energy resources - distribution of metallic (Iron ore, Copper, Bauxite, Manganese); non-
